FOOD AND DRINK

There are refreshment facilities available at the RNCM with the Café, Brodsky Restaurant and the Concert Bar offering a range of fresh, home cooked and locally sourced food from just a coffee and a pastry to a three-course meal.

During the refurbishment of the Concert Hall, opening times will vary, so it is advisable to double check our website for opening times on a particular day.

During term time Monday to Friday, the Café is open from 8am until 6.30pm and Brodsky is open from 11am until 3pm for food and 6pm for drinks. On performance nights, Brodsky is open between 5pm and 7.30pm for dining. The Concert Bar is open from 6pm until 11pm.

HOW TO FIND US

The RNCM is situated 1 mile south of Manchester city centre, in the heart of the Education Quarter, on the corner of Oxford Road and Booth Street West. Oxford Road connects the RNCM by bus to the city centre, and all of Oxford Road, Piccadilly and Victoria train stations. Oxford Road Station is an easy 8 minute walk away.

Why not take advantage of the RNCM's secure underground car park 1 for just £3? It's located next to the college in the basement of Sir Charles Groves Hall off Rosamund Street (open from 5pm on Friday and 8am on Saturday/Sunday) or one of the other car parks 2 and 3 on the map below.
