GAVIN WAYTE

Jacob Fitzgerald began his musical life as a chorister at Jesus College Cambridge, later becoming Head Chorister. Since then, he has gone on to study composition and violin at Aldeburgh Young Musicians and Chetham's School of Music. His work has been performed by ensembles including the Ligeti Quartet, the Brodsky Quartet and by pianist and composer Huw Watkins.

DOUGLAS MASON

Douglas Mason began his musical education as a chorister in Gloucester Cathedral Choir under the late organist and composer, Dr. John Sanders OBE. He read Music at Durham University, was a lay clerk at Leeds Minster for a time and now works at Chetham's School of Music in Manchester in both the Composition and Academic Music departments.

JEREMY PIKE

Jeremy Pike studied violin and piano at the Junior RAM whilst taking composition lessons with Bryan Kelly and Sir Lennox Berkeley. Recent performances of his music have included Processions and Aphelion for violin and piano, both broadcast on BBC Radio 3 from the Wigmore and Bridgewater Halls, Cascades for violin and harpsichord, premièred in Hong Kong and broadcast on RTHK4, and A Forsaken Garden and The Cat and the Moon commissioned for the 2017 and 2018 William Alwyn Festivals. Jeremy has directed the electro-acoustic music studios at the RAM and Warwick University and since 1989 has been Head of Composition at Chetham's School of Music.
