

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

Oxford Road Temporary Traffic Diversion, Monday 8th June - Monday 15th June 2015

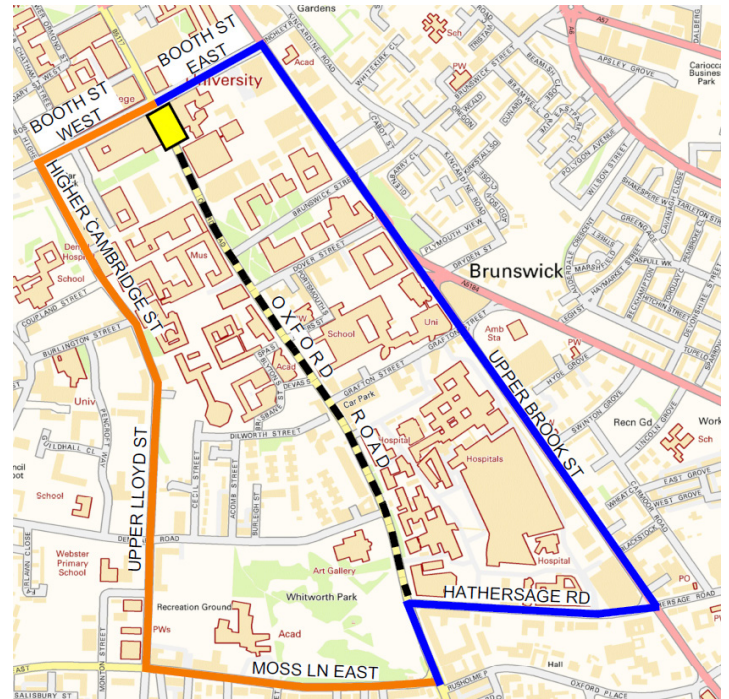
Part of Oxford Road will be closed to all traffic from 8th - 15th June 2015.

Two alternative diversion routes for general traffic will be in place during this time:

Diversion 1: Hathersage Road – Upper Brook Street – Booth Street East.

Diversion 2: Moss Lane East – Upper Lloyd Street/Higher Cambridge Street – Booth Street West.

Buses will also follow diverted routes. Please see overleaf for bus routes affected.

Affected Bus Routes

The diversion will affect bus routes on part of Oxford Road. Buses will leave and re-join Oxford Road at different points between Grosvenor Street and Moss Lane East, depending on the route, as indicated by TfGM on affected bus stops.

Diverted buses will use either Higher Cambridge Street/Upper Lloyd Street, or Upper Brook Street, as follows:

Buses diverted via Higher Cambridge Street

Services 15, 53, 111

Buses diverted via Upper Brook Street

Services 18, 38, 41 42 43 44 142 143 145 (In) 157 X41 X57, 141, 147, 191, 197

The University of Manchester, supported by its development partner, Bruntwood, is currently undertaking a programme of transformational improvements to the University's Oxford Road campus.

As part of this programme, the existing pedestrian bridge over Oxford Road will be demolished. This will allow the Manchester Business School building at Crawford House to be remodelled and refurbished, in-keeping with the University's aspirations for a modern outward-facing campus.

In order to prepare for the demolition, some preliminary work on the bridge and on Oxford Road is needed. This has been scheduled for 8th to 15th June 2015, while the main demolition works are currently scheduled to occur during 10th August to 6th September 2015. Traffic diversions will be in place during both periods.

The work has been scheduled in consultation with TfGM and Manchester City Council to minimise disruption so far as possible. While we recognise the inconvenience, we hope that you will bear with us as we continue to invest in Manchester's future.
