

PRiSM: Call for Scientists in Residence

PRiSM, the RNCM Centre for Practice & Research in Science & Music, is seeking to appoint **two visiting Scientists** for a 12-month residency period **to begin in January 2021**.

Applications are invited from, **but not limited to**, the following research areas:

- Sustainability / Environmental Sciences
- Computer Science / Cognitive Science / Psychology, for example, related to Human-AI Interaction
- Mathematics / Theoretical Physics
- Robotics

Each of the successful PRiSM Scientists in Residence will be required to undertake:

- An original research project, designed to engage with PRiSM's areas of interest and activity
- A written contribution to the PRiSM Blog, reflecting on their research project and the process of collaborating with PRiSM
- Ongoing engagement with PRiSM staff and students throughout the project
- A final presentation (format to be confirmed)

Each PRiSM Scientist in Residence will receive a fee of **£6,000** in order to deliver their proposed projects. This figure is all inclusive, and should include material costs, as well as travel and accommodation costs for any scheduled visits to the RNCM.

Applicants should provide:

- a covering letter, including a description of how your research area engages specifically with PRiSM's areas of interest and activity,
- a full CV, including a list of publications,
- an outline / proposal of your intended research project, with a timeline for completion

RNCM recognises that music is in every culture. We are committed to building a diverse community of staff and students.

The PRiSM Scientist in Residence scheme is primarily intended for individual practitioners, however applications from existing Research Centres, or other collectives of researchers will also be considered.
