

WILLIAMS-HOWARD PRIZE £15,385 RAISED SO FAR

Established by countertenor Michael Harper, The Williams-Howard Prize is a new annual competition celebrating and encouraging the study and performance of art songs by composers of African heritage. Thanks to your support, we have been able to grow this initiative – the first of its type in Europe.

RNCM UKRAINIAN MUSICIANS FUND OVER £50,000 RAISED SO FAR

Launched in response to the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, we are creating pathways for music students from Ukraine to continue their studies with us here in Manchester, providing tuition fee and bursary support, English language training, and health and well-being care. We have welcomed seven students across our undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, Junior RNCM and RNCM Young Artists, and continue to support a number of other students who have sadly encountered challenges on their journeys over to study with us.

Thank you for helping these talented young musicians to continue their studies despite the devastation they have faced.

RNCM ENGAGE: MUSIC EDUCATION

BUILDING BRIDGES AND OVERCOMING BARRIERS

The focus of RNCM Engage is to foster talent and inspire children and young people to make music, whilst safeguarding pathways to conservatoire education. This year, you helped to shape the lives of aspiring musicians through: 'We have watched our daughter flourish and develop into a confident and competent musician. PATHFINDER

Our flagship outreach project providing free bespoke instrument training, mentorship and pastoral support for young people aged 8-18 who demonstrate talent but face financial, social, or cultural barriers to music progression. Your generosity has helped Pathfinder to reach nearly 300 students to date. This year, two Pathfinders will start as RNCM undergraduates, whilst seven passed auditions to join Junior RNCM.

JUNIOR RNCM

Thanks to you, JRNCM continues to offer weekly worldclass training to 200 talented young musicians aged 8-18. It provides a robust foundation to prepare students for Higher Education level study at the RNCM or universities elsewhere.

YOUNG PROJECTS

Exciting instrument-specific opportunities for school-age musicians to develop their musical, technical, and creative skills. Whether first-access or building on experience, your support has ensured we foster a lifelong passion for music.

RNCM YOUNG ARTISTS

With industry sponsorship, we piloted Young Artists – a new Saturday school for 11–18-yearolds to create bands and nurture the next generation of pop musicians. Young Artists will launch in September 2022 and tap into the incredible creativity and ambition of young people who want to make original music. Over 50% of places are provided free of charge to pupils who would not otherwise have been able to attend. 'JRNCM has given me amazing opportunities. CHILDREN'S OPERA

Children's Opera brings the joy of music and live performance to primary school-aged children in our local communities, culminating in an original performance on our Theatre stage.

RNCM YOUNG VOICES

Launched in January 2022 and led by RNCM alumni and students, RNCM Young Voices is an exciting new vocal group for anyone aged 14-18 to rehearse and perform music including pop, gospel, jazz, musicals, and world music with like-minded people in a fun environment.

Thanks to our funders, it is completely free to attend, and participants do not need any previous experience – just energy and a real enthusiasm for singing.

NORTHERN BALLET, CONDUCTING FOR DANCE

New funding has helped us forge an exciting partnership with Northern Ballet – designed to inspire and challenge student conductors on the cusp of embarking on their professional careers. Working with dancers and musicians from Northern Ballet, students gain invaluable professional experience in conducting for dance, opening new career paths and nurturing a pool of talent to be employed by ballet companies worldwide.

BRASS BAND FESTIVAL

Marking the 150th anniversary of the birth of composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, our landmark festival returned from a pandemicenforced hiatus with **A New Beginning** - our vision for a sustainable, relevant, and inclusive future for brass band music. This festival draws some of the top brass bands from across the UK and provides students with an inspiring experience.

STRING QUARTET STUDIO

The String Quartet Studio brought yet another successful year, providing hands-on, immersive training for quartets aiming to reach new heights and explore new directions. Working closely with Donald Grant (Elias Quartet) and our esteemed Chamber Music Faculty, this flexible scheme included a package of career advice and mentoring, ensemble and individual instrument tuition, masterclasses, and more, making it a highly sought-after and unforgettable experience.

The RNCM Creative Innovators Award recognises students who excel in creative entrepreneurship and ambition. Finalists pitched their business ideas and artistic ventures to a panel of industry experts, with five winners receiving a monetary prize to support their innovative projects.
